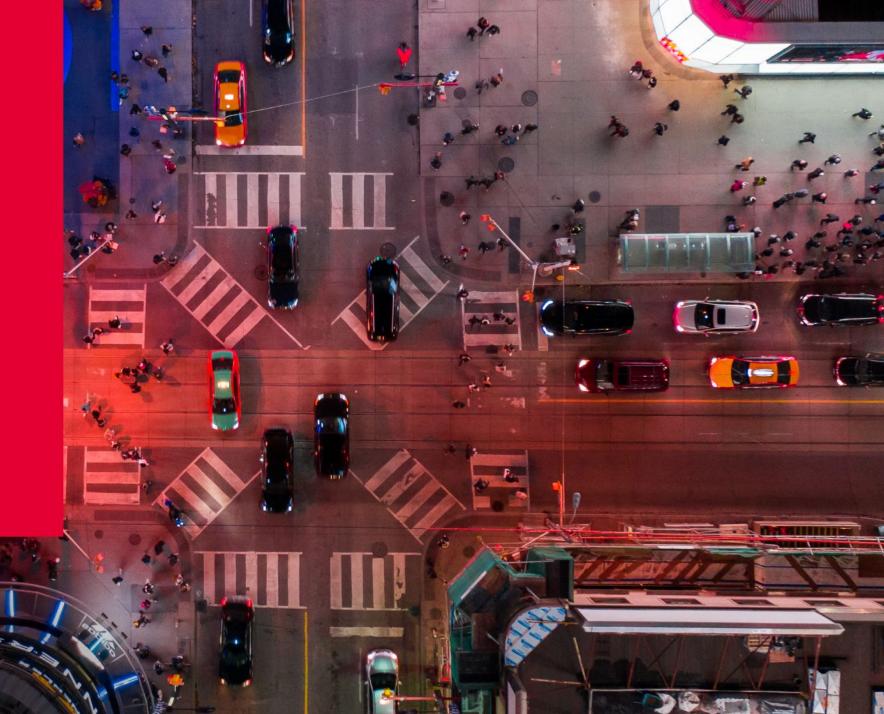

### CivicLabTO: what is it?

"CivicLabTO is a strategic initiative to create a more systemic approach to collaboration"

**How:** brings together students, faculty, researchers, and City staff who seek opportunities for sharing information and best practices.

What? Living lab to encourage engagement with real life problems and complex challenges. Offer the City opportunities for innovation, intellectual exchange of ideas, critical analysis, research and evaluation, and the ability to raise research funds.



Why? Engage in strategies for change and innovation, to test theories, conduct research, use experiential learning, and increase networking.

## CivicLabTO: what do we actually do?

The CivicLabTO program aims to create and strengthen academic research collaborations, knowledge-sharing opportunities, and experiential learning experiences guided by a commitment to equity, inclusion and reconciliation through:

- 1. teaching
- 2. research collaboration
- 3. bi-annual symposium



### case study: City of Toronto course



- 4 colleges + 4 universities
- +300 students from different programs
- 8 professors + over 25 city staff
- 12 week course

- Showcasing the feasibility and cost-effectiveness of electrifying small businesses: Existing Buildings Team, Environment and Climate Division
- The Climate Action and Resiliency Research Fund (CARRF) 3 year fund, \$1m to fund small and mid-sized action projects via CivicLabTO.
